The Meeting will be co-branded, we're going to be the only CV Surgeons there.



- No corrective action plan submitted as yet.

One facility's accreditation expired April 30, 2018 and did not submit an application for reaccreditation.



The Recognized Focused Practice (RFP) in CNS Neuroendovascular Surgery

This RFP is co-sponsored by the American Board of Neurological Surgery, American Board of Radiology, and the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology. The ABNS will serve as the managing ABMS board. This RFP has been approved by the ABMS and has the goal of recognizing candidates who have successfully completed standardized neuroendovascular training and practice criteria, thereby elevating and advancing patient care for the public good.

Individual certification will go through the ABMS, however, institutional will continue to be under CAST


Organizational Structure:

There will be two committees, NESAC (Neuro-Endovascular Surgery Advisory Committee) and CESAC (Credentialing Endovascular Surgery Advisory Committee), that will work collaboratively in the work of fellowship accreditation (NESAC) and fellow credentialing (CESAC). Once established, they will work independently to accomplish their charges. Membership of each committee will consist of equal numbers of representatives from neurological surgery, neuroradiology, and neurology. The chair of NESAC will be selected by SNS-

CAST. The CESAC Chair may be from any of the 3 disciplines, and CESAC will consist of equal representation of the 3 parent organizations, the ABR, ABPN, and ABNS. The chairs will be responsible for providing timely reports back to the parent organizations and for coordinating the timing of and agenda for meetings between the parent organizations and the committee members. NESAC and CESAC will be self-governed with the oversight and approval of their parent organizations.

Fellowship Accreditation: NESAC

Accreditation of fellowships will be done by NESAC under the authority of the Society of Neurological Surgeons through its Committee for Advanced Subspecialty Training (CAST). This committee will establish fellowship educational and training requirements based on agreed upon criteria which will include procedural case volumes available for training fellows, faculty experience, facilities, academic environment, and institutional/departmental support. The NESAC committee will use these criteria to approve fellowship applications from all specialties.


Fellow Credentialing: CESAC

Credentialing of fellows trained in CAST (NESAC) accredited and ACGME fellowships will be done by a committee termed CESAC. This committee will consist of all NESAC members as well as appointees from the ABNS, ABPN, and ABR, with an equal number of experts from all three specialties. CESAC is charged with: 1) writing the cognitive exam (ABNS will refer to this exam as the RFP Endovascular exam), 2) writing an annual adaptive learning tool module to be given in conjunction with member board continuous certification exercises, 3) determining the details of the required practice data submission (both initial and annual) and the metrics by which that data is approved or denied, and 4) recommending approval for initial RFP in CNS Neuroendovascular Surgery by their respective Boards. Although the ABNS will serve as the managing board, RFP Certificates will be issued and maintained by the appropriate ABMS member Board.




Endovascular Pathway for Neurologists

Practice Track Application Pathway

Current neuroendovascular physicians are eligible to achieve RFP credentialing through this practice track regardless of whether they trained in a CAST, ACGME or another type of program by completion of the following steps:

- 1) CESAC review of fellowship training or equivalent clinical experience
- 2) Two consecutive years of practice data after the fellowship will be need to be submitted in an Excel spreadsheet or equivalent to CESAC. Cases may be selected to be entered into ABNS Post for peer review.
- 3) Passing the RFP CNS Endovascular written examination
- 4) Licensing and credentials review
- 5) Two peer letters of recommendation attesting to the candidates' endovascular
- 6) Participation in annual Continuing Certification (learning tool, entry of 65 cases annually into online database)

Current neuroendovascular physicians who are already CAST certified and whose credentials have been forwarded to their respective ABMS boards for RFP can maintain their status by participation in annual Continuing Certification (learning tool, entry of 65 cases annually into online database), and all other requirements of this process going forward.

Continuing Certification for CNS Endovascular Surgery:

- 1) Maintain Primary Board Certification through ABNS, ABPN or ABR
- 2) Proof of Unencumbered certification(s)
- 3) Proof of Unencumbered state license(s)
- 4) Proof of Unencumbered staff privileges in each hospital at which the applicant practices
- 5) Documentation of full participating in MOC/CC per the requirements of primary (and secondary) board(s)
- 6) Cases may be selected to be entered into ABNS Post for peer review. Participants should demonstrate that their practice is actively FOCUSED, by submitting streamlined evidence (patient identifier, date of service and CPT code) that they performed 65 endovascular cases (including angiograms) for the 12 month period in question. The ABNS will audit 1% of participants. The ABNS will provide an online templated form to support this collection which will take minimal time for completion.
- 7) Complete the annual CNS-ES learning tool/ RFP specific module offered via ABNS (on-line)
- 8) There will be a one-year grace period for completion of these requirements without revocation or suspension of the RFP, with potential diplomate review by CESAC.




Adnan Siddiqui: It is not NESAC, it is CESAC. The boards are determining who should be able to get individual certification.


J Mocco: The JC is anxiously awaiting the resolution of this discussion

There's no desire on the part of ABNS to make all Canadians eligible. This is not going to be something that just anyone can become eligible for.










Babu Welch: The whole morning today was guidelines, what's going on now is the acute stroke guidelines are still under review. We're going to come up with a final plan, we're waiting on a response from the AHA. There's a discussion about aspiration, one of the big sticking points is their encouraging individual centers to credential stroke, there's nothing that refers to a specific credentialing criteria. Right now it's imminent on whether or not we'll endorse this. The stroke systems of care update suggested that something like cast be used or grown. The concern is how far along they are in the whole process. There's another few guidelines on non-neurological procedures, but that's still under review. All of the members of the guidelines committee are maintaining their roles.






Bill Mack: the better the meeting, the better the CV section benefits. The best thing for this group is to get people there.




