Winners of this award will be acknowledged at the 2012 AANS/CNS Cerebrovascular Section Meeting.

- There is tremendous variability in the way vasospasm is managed endovascularly (ranging from different IA agents to balloon angioplasty) across the country.
 - It is therefore unclear if one strategy is potentially more effective than another.
 - Proposal: questionnaire to our membership regarding specifically the timing of when endovascular treatment utilized once pt symptomatic, the drugs utilized intra-arterially and the perceived improvement in vessel caliber, and the use of balloon angioplasty.
 - Since there is so much perceived variability across the country in terms of what is being utilized, this will lay the ground work for a potential prospective registry collection of data to better understand if there are certain groups that have more benefit from certain interventions.




EC-IC Bypass for Stroke – is this the end of the line or a bump in the road?
